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From the principal's desk-



Jhargram Raj College (Girls' Wing) was established in 2014 in the forested town of Jhargram, located in erstwhile West Midnapore, now declared an independent district. While a number of other colleges were inaugurated in the same year by Smt. Mamata Banerjee, the honorable CM of West Bengal as part of a massive educational upliftment drive of Junglemahal, Jhargram Raj College Girls' Wing is the only college which serves to cater to the educational needs of women. This unique identity of the college as a safe haven for women who want to pursue higher education, who wish to carve a niche for themselves, who are willing to be masters of their own fate is of special importance in a marginalized area whose socio-economic conditions have not been conducive to the needs and voices of women. Women have been victims of double

deprivation and systemic exploitation in this underprivileged geo-political location and it is through the light of education that Jhargram Raj College Girls' Wing seeks to lead the young women of the area to greater heights and to a better realisation of their own potential. By offering facilities ranging from libraries to sports equipment, from labs to common rooms, from workshops to cultural activities, we are trying to develop our infrastructure in such a way that every student finds her own special place and develops herself accordingly, under the able guidance of our professors. Our government has walked with us every step of the way in ensuring the health and safety of our students as well. We, here at JRCGW, believe in a holistic development of our girls and treat them as nothing less than beautiful buds waiting to blossom into educated, mature, kind and broad-minded citizens who will strive for better lives not just for themselves but will re-envision and renovate their communal and social structures as well in due course of time.

History:

Jhargram Raj College (Girls' Wing) started its journey in 2014 in the backyard of Jhargram Raj College and for the first 3-4 years it was recognized as nothing more than an annexed part of Jhargram Raj College. Some of it was justified because administrative operations were carried out mostly from Jhargram Raj College. The institution, however, started getting recognized and lauded for some of the infrastructural facilities that were being developed and the various activities that were being conducted in the premises. An auditorium with a seating capacity of over 150, housing state-of-the-art screening facilities and CCTV surveillance got JRC Girls' Wing on the map. Prestigious establishments like the Archaeological Survey of India, along with others, preferred and chose this particular venue to host their regional programmes with the aid of the faculty members of the college. This gave greater exposure to the students from remote margins of the JungleMahal area enabling them to be a part of such activities and interactions. In the following years, the college attained incremental independence and, finally, is a completely self-sufficient institution on its own credit with the resources to offer complete support to its staff and students at present. With time, an increasing number of seminars, talks, workshops, film screenings, legalinteractive sessions were organized for the students. The infrastructure has kept on getting more advanced adding lifts, labs, games rooms along with a steady improvement of the academic quotient and cultural activities of the college. More Honours departments were added to both the Science and the Arts faculties along with and overhaul of the intake capacity of

the students. More facilities like a cycle stand, rainwater harvesting systems, women's hostels are underway. Afforestation programmes are religiously carried out every few months or as and when required. As part of its community care projects, the college has also adopted a remote lodha-sabar village, taken its tiny tots under the wing of the faculty members who have vowed to take care of their educational needs. Students are encouraged to actively participate in all of the above so that they can inculcate the spirit of social consciousness, environmental awareness along with a holistic evolution of their personalities. The institution has tried to uplift and will continue to strive to care for its ecological and social ecosystem as long as it exists and develop sustainably for a better and brighter future.

Mission and Vision:

We, as citizens of this country, are all concerned about development and to be more specific human development. Each one of us wants all kinds of opportunities and freedoms to live a kind of life that we value. The process of development should at least create an environment for us to develop our full potential and to have a reasonable chance of leading productive and creative lives.

This college by providing the girls of the area with an opportunity of education open the door to this possibility. The vision is to boost their capabilities so that they can take control of their own lives. This is essential to enable them to make proper use of the opportunities they get. The college with all its infrastructure along with scholarships provided by the government creates the opportunity while the faculty members hailing from myriad backgrounds tend to take extra care in encouraging the students to make good use of these to become empowered individuals.

We all know that women have achieved their right to education after a long struggle and our mission is to preserve and develop the fruits of that struggle. We also know that women empowerment, both psychological and financial, is the only way to prevent a large number of crimes against women. *Our mission* therefore is not just to impart formal education but also to raise consciousness among the girls about their position in society and how to change it for the better. Societal change is incremental. *Our vision*, therefore since the inception, has been to create a new generation of women in the area who are progressive, confident, empowered, who believe in gender equality and know how to claim their rights amidst adversities.

Profile of the College:

Location: Jhargram Raj College (Girls' Wing) is situated in the town of Jhargram, the District Head Quarters of Jhargram. It takes about 15 minutes from Jhargram Rail Station. Government and private buses are also available from the nearby towns like Kharagpur and Midnapore. It is about 22 Km by road from Mumbai Kolkata national highway.

NSOU: Jhargram Raj College Girls' Wing has been established as a study centre of Netaji Subhas Open University in late 2014 and has been operational since 2015 as Study Centre J-10. This study centre has been and will continue to be immensely helpful for working men and women or even others who do not have the scope to attend regular classes but are interested in pursuing higher education. Undergraduate courses (BDP) are offered in various Science and Arts subjects namely, Mathematics, Economics, English, Bengali, History, Political Science, Public Administration and Sociology. Post Graduate courses (PG) are offered in Mathematics, English, Bengali and History. Classes are held on weekends from 11 AM -2 PM during the months of October – March after the distribution of Study Material (SLM) in September. Students are updated regarding all details via WhatsApp and sms apart from the information put up timely on the study centre notice board. Since the inception of the Centre, more than 1200 students have

attained their UG degree and more than 700 have attained their PG degree. In the current academic session, more than 200 students are pursuing their Post Graduate studies and more than 700 students are enrolled in the UG programme. Departments: The college has 9 undergraduate departments, where Honours courses and associated Multidisciplinary courses are taught. The Multidisciplinary course curriculums are also offered to the students. All courses will follow the proposed NEP structure in accordance with guidelines issued by Vidyasagar University.

Infrastructure: Since its inception in 2014, this college has come a long way in infrastructure development. The four storey building has a large number of well-lit and spacious classrooms with white boards. We have an auditorium with all technologically smart set up like projectors, sound system etc. We also have smart class infrastructure. There is a provision of common room for girls. We have water purifiers with coolers to ensure drinking water supply for the students and sanitary napkin dispenser machine in the female washroom as well. We have installed sanitizer dispensers as it is the need of the hour. Elevator has also been installed recently. For bio-science courses, the college has laboratory for conducting practical classes. For additional security of girls, the college has CCTV cameras at different locations in all the floors with a live feed to the Principal's office. The college also houses a study centre of the Netaji Subhas Open University for those who pursue courses in the distance education format.

Library: The library of the college started with the establishment of the institution that is 2014. Dr S Radhakrishnan once said that "Library is a heart of an institution", that makes it pretty clear about the importance of existence and services of library. There is one central library spread across two floors with around 3700+ books and magazine. It also contains inspirational and motivational books along with preparatory books related to competitive exams. Apart from circulation of books, the library also provides reading facility for the entire student's community of the college, teachers, and its' non-teaching staff members. Till now library was operated fully on manual mode, but we are much excited to introduce Integrated Library Management Software (ILMS) to automate the college library; the college authority is on the right track to do so.

With the establishment of Jhargram Raj College (Girls' Wing), the NSS unit was also created to engage the students in social service. The Principal, the teaching and non-teaching faculty members as well as the students have come together on various occasions to ensure the college makes a positive contribution to society.

The activities of the NSS unit are not limited to the confines of the college. It plays an integral role in the locality by lending a helping hand to people beyond the college by enhancing their holistic development. The NSS unit also tries to increase awareness about cleanliness, personal hygiene as well as the importance of a pollution-free environment. It has also adopted a backward village, Satyaban Pally, located near the college and provides the children there with free stationery and clothes as well as household items like bleaching powder, detergent, disinfectants and phenyl to promote sanitation. The unit has also taken up the task of organizing campaigns to spread awareness regarding personal hygiene. It has also started a school for the children of a Shabar village near Pukuria called the 'Chuni KotalPathshala' which has taken around 25 children under its wing.

The college conducts an orientation programme for the students before the commencement of classes so that they are acquainted with the nature of academic journey they are about to undertake, develop a preliminary bond with the teachers, know the academic environment and gain certain perspectives regarding expectations from college life. This practice has been maintained till date across the various course frameworks that have been devised from time to time like the undergraduate 3 tier framework (annual format) and the CBCS framework (semester format). The education system is being overhauled under the current New Education Policy framework and the college will continue the existing practice of orienting the students with greater care. In the programme, the teachers of each department interact with the students and enlighten them about the vision and mission of each discipline and department. They are also introduced to various social and cultural activities of the college which falls under the co-curricular framework. 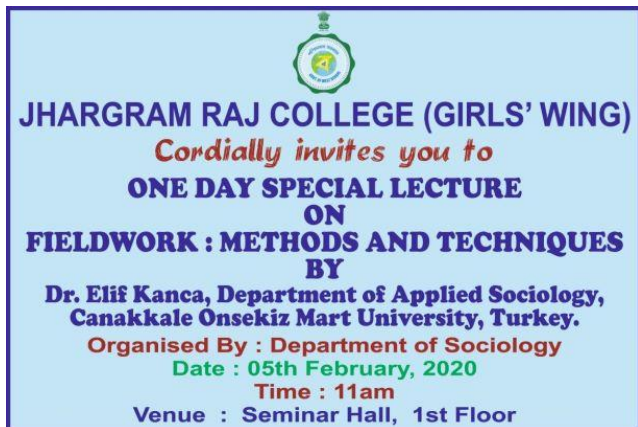

Departmental Overview

Department of Bengali:

Literature is the mirror of life – the life that has multiple manifestations and flows in different directions .

Keeping this in mind, the department of Bengali, established in 2014, tries to inculcate the idea of the culture of the land among the students . Focus is placed not just on the study of past Bengali literary culture but also on understanding the literary transitions keeping the current socio - economic context in mind .

The library stocked by the faculty members is a repository of oriental and western literature that can be used by the students for knowledge enrichment.

The department has tried to move out of the traditional student -teacher formal relationship framework to a more informal friend -philosopher- guide kind .

The students have performed well in University exams and have gone ahead to pursue higher studies. Some have also done well on the employment front .

Department of English:

The study of literature has been a favorite with people of all generations. It isn't just about reading for pleasure or about memorizing some theoretical paradigm but it is about opening our minds to myriad perspectives of life, living and the evaluation of the design of our thoughts and actions. Our students, over the years, have incorporated this vision into the philosophy of their lives.

We here, do not encourage students to join this course to attain a better grasp of the English language as that is not what the study of Literature is about. Literature is about honing our psychological faculties to re-frame our immediate and broader society in terms of empathy, insight, equity, balance and sustainability. Our students are pursuing higher education in various Universities or working as teachers, nurses, artists, business women and in other capacities in both public and private sector organizations.

Department of History:

It is one of the founding departments of Jhargram Raj College (Girls' Wing) which was established in the year 2014. The Academic curriculum of the department of history is based on the Choice Based Credit System under the University of Vidyasagar. It focuses upon the good academic performance and gives utmost importance to active learning in the form of discussions, presentation, seminars and talks by eminent dignitaries and academicians.

The students are monitored by individual assignment and internal assessments. Evaluations are made on the basis of regular classes and university examinations.

Department of Philosophy

This is exactly the aim of this department. In the seven years of its existence this department has a great pride in growing its academic performance. It has contributed a lot in the field of women's education. True to the spirit of Descartes, the teachers of this department guide the students towards developing their talent in various fields by involving them in debates, seminars and discussions in class. Students are encouraged to participate in activities other than their curriculum like NSS, several cultural activities and sports among other things. Our alumni are pursuing higher studies from eminent Universities.

Department of Political Science

Political Science as an academic discipline has evolved over centuries. Hence, the Department of Political Science has rightly been introduced in our college, since 2014.

As students of political science, they learn the journey of this discipline through a large number of sub- disciplines like political sociology, political economy, public administration, international relations, comparative politics to name a few. Studying political science opens up the analytical capabilities to understand all the events happening around. The study of this discipline helps to create awareness and increase the political education of the people in the society. Students completing under-graduation can opt for civil services, media, research, education, law, NGOs and several other fields as career opportunities.

Department of Sanskrit:

The Department of Sanskrit was established in 2014 initially with B.A General Course and in 2016 the Honours Course came into being. Prof. Nazninmullick was the first faculty member of the department and present Head of the Department. Now Dr. Pritam Ghosal is also a faculty of the department since 2016. At Present there is an ever-rising demand for Sanskrit in Under-Graduate Courses in this College.

Department of Sociology

The Department of Sociology got established in August, 2014. It offers B.A degree in Sociology (Honours and General). The study of Sociology offers to help the students to understand human society and scientific study of the social relationships by which a social system works.

The first Honours batch of the Department of Sociology passed out in 2019. Besides academics, students collectively participate in a range of extra-curricular activities. The Department has conducted several International, National and State level lectures, workshops and webinars since its establishment.

Sociology as an academic discipline has a range of career options such as employment in academic and research institutes, public health and welfare departments, policy analyst, social workers, public relations workers, journalist, counsellors, Human Resource (HR) specialists, market research analyst and so on.

B.Sc (General)

B.Sc. general department of Jhargram Raj College (Girls' Wing) consists of three different departments - Botany, Physiology and Zoology. The general course of bio-science is affiliated to the Vidyasagar University.

Department of Zoology

The department of Zoology has passed through a progressive journey since its inception. This course offers an opportunity for a comprehensive study of animal bio-diversity, animal behavior, taxonomy, ecology, biochemistry, etc through classroom lectures, practical's, interactive sessions, seminars and workshops. To make the subject more interesting and purposeful demonstrative methods are used. The department has a well-equipped laboratory and necessary infrastructure to meet the academic demands of the students.

Department of Physiology

This department has been integral to the college since the beginning. This department offers general courses under the CBCS system followed by the Vidyasagar University. It continuously caters to the academic and intellectual aspirations of the students inclined to this discipline. Discipline: Students admitted to this College should follow the rules and regulations of the college, University and the order of the principal/OIC. No student can plead ignorance of such rules and orders.

- Regular attendance in keeping with the stipulations of Vidyasagar University must be maintained. in order to appear in the university examination.
- Notice boards are to be checked regularly.
- A student must carry with her an updated identity card issued from the college.
- Use of mobile phones is strictly prohibited inside the classrooms and corridors during college hours.
